"With the season of Lent upon us, we use the paintings in the Pinacoteca to guide us through a spiritual reflection on the Five Sorrowful Mysteries of the Rosary."

Art can often be a beautiful means of reflection. Continuing with his Lenten reflections, Fr. Lixey guides video reflections of the second through fifth Sorrowful Mysteries of the Rosary through the following pieces in the Pinacoteca.

Second Sorrowful Mystery: The Scourging at the Pillar The Flagellation - Master of the Trevi Crucifix

Third Sorrowful Mystery: The Crowning with Thorns Wooden Bust of Ecce Homo - Artist unknown

Fourth Sorrowful Mystery: The Carrying of the Cross Christ bearing the cross - Marco Palmezzano

Fifth Sorrowful Mystery: The Crucifixion
The Crucifixion Between Saints Venantius, Peter,
John the Baptist and Porphyry - L'Alunno, 1480 ca.
